# PLANT PARTY!

The Trust is hosting our 6th annual plant sale! We've selected a variety of native beauties that we think will be suited to your gardens and are on the approved plant list for the preserve! We're working with 3 local nurseries that grow native plants exclusively to give you a selection of species that support native pollinators, birds, and other critters. If you purchased plants last year, you may notice that those selections may not be available this year. We have adjusted the plant list to the 2023 availability from our local growers. That said, new plant options have been added to make up for the removal of previous plant options.

## Note:

If you are used to going to a nursery and picking up plants that are in bloom and in their prime, these plants will look different to you. Some of the plants will be started from seed in early Spring and will be quite small. Other larger and older plants will have been overwintered and depending on the plant, may just be coming up in the pots. This is totally normal for this time of year. With a little patience and care, you should have a great-looking plant later in the season or in some cases, the following year based on transplant dormancy. - MONARCH HOST PLANT/NECTAR SOURCE; ATTRACTS BUTTERFLIES AND HUMMINGBIRDS
- UNLIKE COMMON MILKWEED, DOESN'T SPREAD MUCH VIA RHIZOMES, SO WILL NOT TAKE OVER
- PERENNIAL, BUT TYPICALLY LIVES ONLY 5-6 YRS.

- ERECT LEAFY STEMS, OFTEN IN CLUSTERS, WITH RACEMES OF FLOWERS RESEMBLING FLAMING RED SPIRES
- WILL DO WELL PLANTED ALONGSIDE STREAMS/WATER FEATURES

- SMALL; WELL-SUITED TO GARDEN SPACES
- BERRIES ARE ENJOYED BY BIRDS
- NOTE THAT THIS PLANT IS MILDLY TOXIC TO HUMANS AND SOME ANIMALS- BERRIES HOLD THE MOST CONCENTRATION OF TOXINS

**BUTTONBUSH***CEPHALANTHUS OCCIDENTALIS*

- "PINCUSHION" FLOWERS DEVELOP INTO ROUND RED "BUTTONS" THAT ADD COLOR AND INTEREST IN THE WINTER



## PERSIMMON

*DIOSPYROS VIRGINIANA*

- SMALL FRAGRANT FLOWERS BLOOM MAY-JUNE
- DELICIOUS, DATE-LIKE ORANGE FRUITS MATURE IN THE FALL AFTER THE FIRST FROST AND ARE A FAVORITE OF POSSUMS AND DEER
- DISTINCTIVE, GRAY BLOCKY BARK
- SPECTACULAR YELLOW TO FLAME-LIKE FALL FOLIAGE





## RED MULBERRY

*MORUS RUBRA*

- DENSE CANOPIED TREE THAT PRODUCES DELICIOUS BLACKBERRY-LIKE FRUIT IN SUMMER
- BERRIES AND TWIGS ARE A FAVORITE OF SEVERAL WILDLIFE SPECIES, ESPECIALLY BIRDS
- BEST TO PLANT 2-3 TO ENSURE POLLINATION
- BERRIES CAN BE MESSY, AVOID PLANTING NEAR DRIVEWAYS, PATHS





## AMERICAN HAZELNUT

*CORYLUS AMERICANA*

- MULTI-STEMMED SHRUB WITH A ROUNDED TOP AND AN OPEN, OFTEN WIDE-SPREADING BASE
- PRODUCES EDIBLE NUTS LATE SUMMER—EARLY FALL FOR HUMANS AND WILDLIFE
- GREAT CHOICE FOR HEDGEROW OR WINDBREAK
- SHOULD BE PLANTED IN MULTIPLES (2 OR 3) TO ENSURE CROSS-POLLINATION.





## SPICEBUSH

*LINDERA BENZOIN*

- HOST PLANT FOR SPICEBUSH AND EASTER TIGER SWALLOWTAIL BUTTERFLIES; FLOWERS ALSO ATTRACT BIRDS
- FAST GROWING; BRIGHT YELLOW BLOOMS IN SPRING BEFORE LEAVES COME OUT; BRIGHT RED BERRIES AND BEAUTIFUL FALL COLOR
- A TEA CAN BE MADE FROM THE AROMATIC LEAVES AND TWIGS







- RESEEDS EASILY AND FORMS COLONIES







- COMBAT SOILS EROSION ON SLOPES AND ACTS AS WINTER COVER FOR SMALL BIRDS AND MAMMALS






